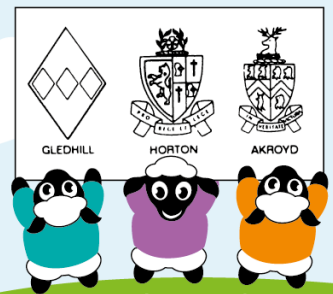

Dear Parents/Carers

We are writing to give you advance notice that Barkisland will be taking part in **World Book Day** on **Thursday 7th March**.

PE lessons on Thursday 7th March
Nursery, Reception, Y1 and Y3 **ARE NOT** doing PE on this Day and should come in their World Book Day costumes to school.

On this day, the children are invited to dress up as their favourite character and will be involved in a series of exciting book related activities in their classroom. There isn't a requirement to buy a costume as there will be many things that you can use from home. We would also like the children to bring in their favourite book to share with their friends during social reading sessions that day.

This year we are running **optional** competitions. If your child does not want to take part there is no pressure to do so. For Nursery, Reception Y1 and Y2 we are asking that the children use a toilet roll or wooden spoon to create their favourite character from a book (some examples below).



For KS2 we are asking that if the children would like to do so, please design and create a story in a box (see picture to the right).

These are to be brought to school on **World Book Day, Thursday 7th March** where they will be judged and there will be book vouchers as prizes.

The children should have received their £1 book tokens to use against a selection of books, including books costing £1. This enables every child in the country to own a book for free.
