

Lunchtime Arrangements

Children may bring either a packed lunch or have a school meal.

The majority of children opt for our own popular school meals service, which is cooked daily on the premises by our own cook in our on-site kitchen. The school meals system operates on a two week cycle and menus are sent home prior to each cycle. This then enables the children themselves to choose, in advance, what they would like to eat, under (of course!) parental guidance. The cost of each school meal is $\pounds 2.50$ per day. Children in Reception and Nursery eat their lunch within their unit space.



Free School Meals

As part of the Universal Free School Meals imitative, all KS1 and Reception aged children are able to receive free school lunches. Free School Meals may be available for school children of parents or guardians who receive one of the following:

- Universal Credit your net earned income must be less than £7,400.
- Income Support.
- Job Seeker's Allowance (income based).
- Employment and Support Allowance.
- Child Tax Credit. (With an annual income of less than £16,190. As assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs.)
- Guarantee Credit element of Pension Credit.
- Support payments under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- Working Tax Credit Run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit).

Application forms can be downloaded from our website or obtained via the school office.

Free school meal information is held totally confidentially in school, children are unaware of this issue.



Healthy Lifestyles

Children are actively encouraged to make healthy lifestyle choices. We support this through our PE and PSHCE curriculum. Our KS1 pupils benefit from access to a free piece of fruit each day. KS2 children are free to bring in a healthy snack to eat at morning break times. We have a fabulous running track which enables us to take part in the Daily Mile.

Every child is issued with a water bottle when they start with us in Nursery or Reception. These bottles are filled with water at home and brought into school each day. Children have free access to water throughout the school day.

We also use 'Cool Milk' for our supplies of milk for children. School milk is free for all under-fives and is subsidised for pupils aged five or older, at around £15 a term. To register visit www.coolmilk.com

School Uniform

The school expects all children to adhere to our school uniform.

The uniform comprises: of:

• Grey trousers or skirt (of an appropriate length) or pinafore, navy sweatshirt or cardigan and pale blue shirt/polo shirt. Grey shorts may be worn in the summer months.

• A dark or light blue school dress may be worn in the summer term and early September.

Navy blue sweatshirts /cardigans and pale blue polo shirts, embroidered with the school coat of arms may

be ordered from school. Plain polo shirts, sweatshirts and cardigans can also be worn as part of the school uniform.

Nursery children are encouraged to wear the top half of our uniform i.e. blue polo and navy jumper/cardigan with dark coloured joggers / leggings.

Children should wear sensible flat shoes in black, trainers are not permitted. Black boots may be worn during winter months.

Uniform and Presentation Expectations.

- If hair is long enough it must be tied back. Any hair accessories must be in line with the school colours and kept to a minimum.
- Stud earrings only may be worn for school, no other jewellery, although a watch is permitted. This is to ensure the safety of all children.
- Nail varnish is not permitted to be worn in school.
- Earrings, must be removed by the child before PE lessons. (For Health and Safety reasons adults are not permitted to remove earrings from children.)

<u>PE Kit</u>

For health, hygiene and safety reasons, children come to school in their PE kit on their designated PE days. For any extra-curricular activities which require a PE kit, children bring kit from home on the required day.

Indoor PE; children should wear navy blue or black shorts and a pale blue T-shirt, available from the school, and plimsolls.

Outdoor games; children should wear navy blue or black shorts, pale blue T-shirt and trainers.

- School hoodies are also available for outdoor PE and are available to buy on School Money
- In colder weather, a sweatshirt and jogging bottoms in black or blue are advisable.
 All uniform items MUST be clearly labelled.





Behaviour



We aim to create a caring, Christian community where relationships are positive and supportive. Within this atmosphere, children are able to develop confidence, self respect and respect for others. We encourage all children to show consideration for others, and rules exist for the safety and well being of everyone. Good behaviour / effort / work and politeness is rewarded during Friday morning assemblies. Merit certificates and house points are presented to children, nominated by their class teachers. A behaviour and antibullying policy has been adopted following discussions with children, staff, parents and governors. Sanctions are applied fairly and firmly, when necessary, in line with both policies.

Parental Support

Parental support and encouragement is vital in order for children to excel. At Barkisland, parental support is excellent; we work well with our families in order to promote this. Supporting children at home with homework tasks such as reading and projects is expected. We welcome any support in school from adults, please speak to a member of staff if you can help in anyway. Parents are also welcomed into school regularly to share successes, for information sessions and to join in with various events.





Pupil Voice

At Barkisland, we believe that everyone's voice is important and should be heard.

All children belong to our school council. Regular themes are explored in class and children with strong ideas or a desire to support work around a particular theme, form a working party to implement positive changes to the school and the community.

Children can also apply for many different roles in school.. Learning Detectives will work with staff to monitor different subject areas to

identify positive aspects and suggest improvements. Worship Leaders support daily Collective Worship, support evaluations and lead worship regularly. Befrienders and playleaders are trained to support effective playtimes by facilitating play and games for children.

Barkisland School Association (BSA)

Our BSA is an important group of people who work together to organise events to raise additional funds for the school. The funds are spent on a wide variety of things e.g. coaches for school trips, extra resources in school, Christmas and Easter gifts. They have recently supported the school in purchasing new reading books and ipads. Thank you!

Regular events include discos, summer fares, magic evenings, Balls and many more. The team meet usually about once every half term, and new members are always welcome (even if you cannot commit to attending every meeting).





Extra-curricular activities

A range of activities are offered to children during the school year and will vary from year to year and term to term. Many of our staff run extra curricular clubs and we also use some outside agencies to provide more specialist coaching in areas. Clubs run in the past include:



Football, Netball, Arts and Craft,

Reading, Athletics, Multi Skills, Cross Country and Science Club to name a few.

We run a residential course for our Year 6 children annually, where outdoor and adventurous activities are offered. These include canoeing, caving, archery and orienteering. The residential visit is always keenly anticipated by the children and consistently proves to be invaluable to the personal and social development of our pupils. We also run a shorter residential for our Year 5 pupils.

Our Year 4 children participate in swimming lessons weekly for the entire academic year.

We offer a wide range of musical tuition in school from Brass to Strings, Guitar to Piano. Music is a key area which we offer children the opportunities to develop their musical knowledge, skill and application.

Y3 - learn to play recorders and read music.

Y4 - Brass

Y5 and Y6 - learn to play the Ukulele with a focus on composition.



Out of School Care —Kids Club

The Barkisland Kids Club offers child care facilities both before and after school in the Sutton Hall and is a very popular club.

Morning sessions run from 7.30am to 8.45 am and evening sessions from 3.30 pm to 6.00 pm.

The Club is also open during school holidays between 8am and 6pm. Further information can be obtained from the school office.

Children enjoy attending our Kids Club where they have the opportunity to play with a wide range of resources.



Christian Ethos




Children take part in a daily act of worship. This involves the whole school on each day, with a special 'Merit Assembly' every Friday morning, to which parents and relatives are very welcome. Worship follows themes which are planned annually in discussion with the Church and support our core values.

The assembly themes are at the centre of our religious and moral education, and reflect our Church of England school status. However, we prepare children for life in a multi-cultural society and some of our themes will explore other faiths often attending other places of worship as well as

our local Christian Church.

We respect the right of any parents who wish to withdraw their children from collective worship.

We welcome members of the Clergy into school to lead Collective Worship on a regular basis. We also attend services each term in Christ Church.



Our Curriculum

We teach following the National Curriculum and the Diocesan Syllabus for Religious Education. We enrich this by inviting visitors into school and planning for visits outside of school also. Our highly skilled staff team carefully plan exciting and fun lessons which enable all of our children to learn and progress to reach their full potential.

Expectations of all of our children are extremely high and we encourage them to excel in all that they encounter at school—this includes academic success but focuses on all aspects of the curriculum; including social and spiritual development.

We regularly take part in various sporting competitions and our trophy unit is growing rapidly, of which we are extremely proud of.



Barkisland 'Little Lambs' Nursery Provision



This provision runs within our Early Years Unit. We have capacity for 24 Nursery aged children and we can admit children the term following their third birthday. Parents/Carers are able to use their free 15/30 hours free entitlement at our Nursery provision.



We are also able to offer wrap around care from 7.30am until 6.00pm during term time. During holiday periods, we can offer childcare for our Nursery pupils from 8.00am until 6pm.

Inclusivity

Barkisland is an inclusive school, in which the teaching and learning, achievements, attitudes and well being of every young person matters. We recognise that every child has individual learning needs and we work hard to ensure that our curriculum caters for this. The school is supported by other professionals and outside agencies.

Any pupil identified as having Special Educational Needs will receive tailored learning and provision relevant to their individual needs. This is managed in school by class teachers, supported by our Inclusion Manager.



Absences From School

Regular attendance at school is crucial to children's learning.

If your child is ill and is unable to attend school, parents need to contact school in the morning to notify us of this, this can be done via phone call, email or on School Spider. If we do not hear by 9.30am, the office staff will contact you to ascertain the reason for your child's absence. If we are unable to contact you, we will contact the emergency contacts we hold for your child. If contact still can not be made, we may conduct a home visit.

We expect routine medical appointments to be made outside of the school day. Although we understand that some medical appointments may have to be attended during the school day; if this is the case, a form can be found on our



website where the reason for absence can be detailed and sent into the school office, along with a copy of the appointment letter/card.

The headteacher is not able to authorise any term time absence for family holidays unless there are exceptional circumstances. A form requesting absence can be found on the school website or by contacting the school office. All requests for absence must be made as far in advance as possible and by completing the relevant paperwork.

Attendance letters are sent home every term if a child's attendance has fallen below 95%.

Charging Policy

In order to enrich our curriculum further, children will have to opportunity to take part in class visits and trips or invite special visitors into school. We may ask for contributions towards the cost of special events. The contributions will cover the costs involved and no profits are made. We will never prevent any child from taking part in any of these activities but we do reserve the right to cancel if not enough contributions are raised to cover the costs.



Queries, Concerns and Complaints

Families and school working together are key to a child's happy and successful time at school. However, there may be times when you have concerns about particular aspects of school life. Your child's class teacher is usually your first point of contact. If the concern needs to be discussed further, then an appointment to see the Headteacher / Deputy Headteacher can be made. We would always recommend parents talk with school first, as often, issues can be resolved quickly this way.

If needed, our complaints policy and ways to communicate with school can be found on our website or by asking the school office for a copy.



Sending Your Child To Our School

Starting school is one of the most important milestones in a child's life and it is important that the right school is chosen for your child.

If your child is due to start school, appointments can be made through the school office to meet with the Headteacher and have a tour of our school. These appointments can be made from October to December the year before your child is due to begin school. If you are looking to move your child from another school, please contact the



school office to make an appointment to look around.

Any applications need to be made via Calderdale Council's Admissions Team.

We do not hold special open days - we like prospective parents to see the school in action on a 'typical' day!

These appointments are for parents to view the school and ask the Headteacher any questions; it is not usually appropriate for children to attend as this can be daunting.

Children will get opportunities to visit their school once a place has been allocated.

Our Admission Policy should be read carefully upon making an application. This can be found on our website.

Once a place has been allocated at school, we will invite parents to an information evening to explain everything that you and your child will need to know before they begin. Children will be able to visit their new class and teacher before September. These events happen in June and July.



Children will then start school full time in September!



The Governing Body

As a Church of England Voluntary Aided School, the Governing Body is responsible for the overall management of the school. They delegate the day to day running of the school to the Headteacher.



We have 14 Governors on our Governing Body, made up as follows:

8 Foundation Governors, including:
1 Local Authority Governor,
The Headteacher,
1 Staff Governor,
2 Parent Governors
And 1 co-opted Governor.
